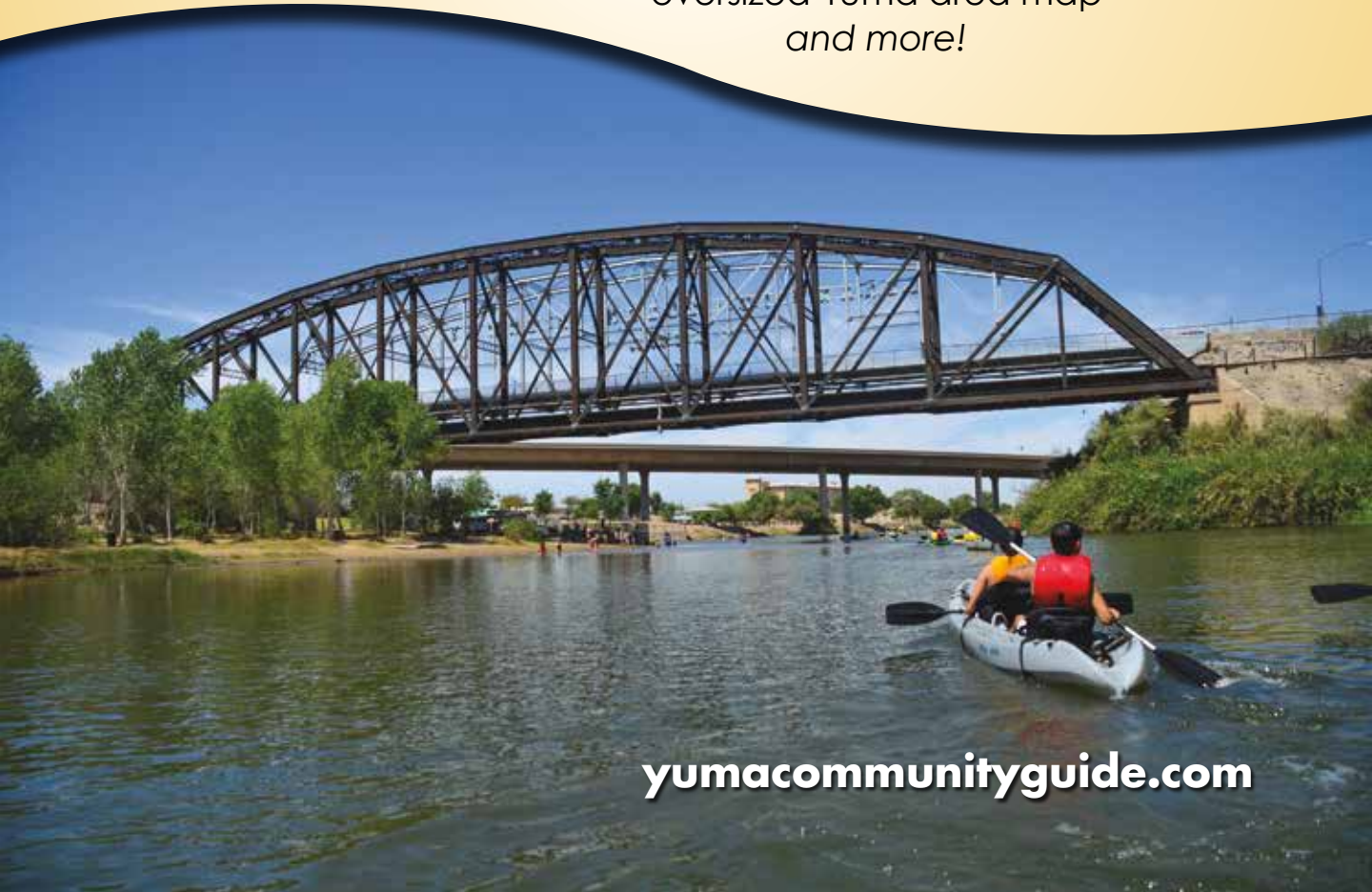

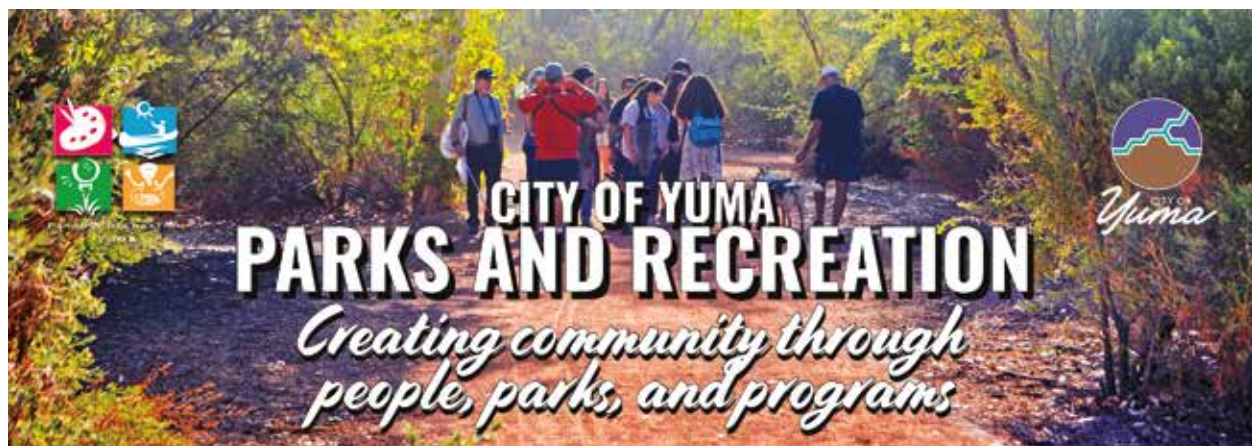

Yuma is also a military town as the second largest industry, with two bases - the Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) at the Yuma International Airport and the Yuma Proving Ground, northeast of Yuma off Hwy. 95.

Tourism is the third largest local industry, becoming a "must" convenient stop off 1-8, approx half way between San Diego and Tucson or greater Phoenix area. As electric vehicles gain popularity, more will stop to "recharge" enticing an extended stay to enjoy

the variety of places to dine, shop and tour. We all miss the Canadian "birds" this season, and look forward to their return next year.

Neighbors Up and Down the Road

The Foothills—Yuma, Arizona

The Foothills, just east of Yuma, is a separate unincorporated bedroom community in Yuma County, offering its residents full services, a variety of eateries and recreational opportunities. It has easy access off I-8, with three exits - 9, 12 and 14.

This rapidly expanding area grew 25% in the past 10 years, with a current population of over 35,000. There has been interest in annexing this community into the City of Yuma, but local residents appreciate their independence and have resisted such efforts.

Water and sewer services are privately owned and operated. All streets are paved, accessing a variety of oversized residential lot options, including RV lots with pad and storage, some with 2-50 amp hookup park models, modular homes, and site-built homes, some valued at over \$350,000. The newer cluster of homes comprise the more "upscale" neighborhood in the southeastern area, close to the Gila Mountains with a slight elevation to enjoy the distant views.

In addition to numerous desirable RV resorts, many of the private oversized lots are available for rent during snowbird season for

those wanting a quiet setting without the RV park atmosphere.

Enjoy all the Foothills offers with a variety of retail, dining, medical and professional services, and local recreational opportunities.

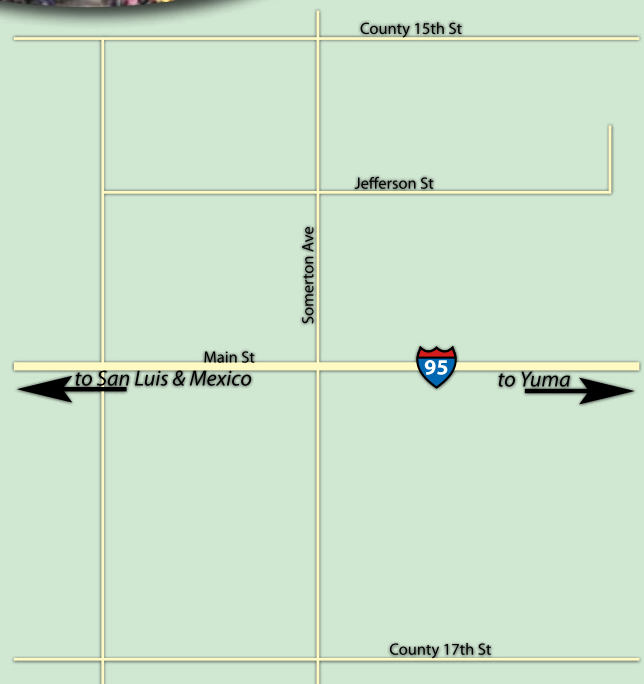
Somerton

Just 12 miles south of Yuma, in the fertile Yuma Valley, you'll find this primarily agricultural city of Somerton, population 16,000. You can drive the same distance south to Mexico as you go southwest on Hwy. 95 through San Luis, AZ. Somerton was founded in 1898 and incorporated in 1918, on land once claimed for the fraudulent Rancho El Paso de los Algodones [land] Grant. This property along the Colorado River was very attractive to speculators. The U.S. Congress passed a law that allowed settlers who were on the land prior to May 25, 1898 to buy up to 40 acres for only \$1.25 per acre.

In addition to agriculture, there is continual residential and light industrial growth. Citrus and vegetable growing and processing employs many local residents. The community is experiencing an increase in retail services.

There are great family operated places for lunch or dinner, and the Cocopah Resort Casino and the Cocopah Tribe's Wild River Entertainment Center, Museum Cultural Center, & Speedway offer excellent recreation hubs. Check their scheduled activities and events while you're visiting Somerton.

Wellton

Located 29 miles east of Yuma on the east side of the Gila Mountains, the town of Wellton serves the surrounding production of agricultural products. During the winter season, the population of 3,500 almost doubles as seasonal residents flock from the northwestern states and Canada to the local RV parks. It's no wonder, with so many warm, sunny days that the Wellton area has become such a popular seasonal mature adult destination.

Once a water stop for the Butterfield Overland Mail stagecoaches and then the Southern Pacific Railroad, this small town was founded in 1878. As cars came into use, "Well Town", named for the water wells to supply the railroad, became Wellton, primarily an agricultural community.

Coyote Wash Center is located just south of I-8 at the Wellton exit, on Commerce Way. The Town of Wellton Coyote Wash Golf Course is a short distance south, surrounded by the master-planned community of Coyote Wash. The town's popular Butterfield Golf Course is north, at the southeast corner of E. Mountain View Ave. and Dome St.

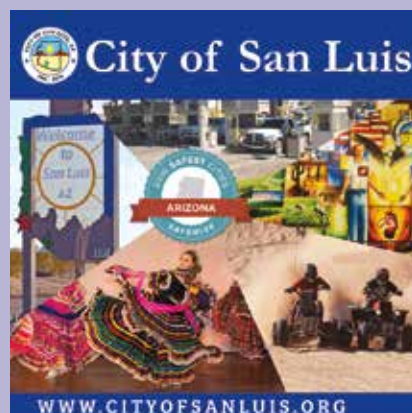
San Luis

Just 12 miles south of Somerton, at the most southwestern corner of Arizona, on the north side of the Mexico border, San Luis is experiencing growth to its current 35,000 population, comprised of younger aged residents. With its south-of-the-border neighbor, San Luis Rio Colorado, the active port of entry provides continuous trade of industrial, commercial and agricultural products and services. It also offers bi-national recreational and cultural interests.

Its southern neighbor offers a true taste of Mexican flavor with unique shopping and open air markets selling Mexican souvenirs, handmade jewelry, art, crafts and pottery. There are affordable medical, dental and pharmaceutical services within walking distance of the border.

San Luis is the "gateway" to the Sea of Cortez, with Golfo de Santa Clara only 70 miles south, offering an abundance of water oriented recreational enjoyment and access to fresh seafood. The new coastal toll highway, La Costera, connects with Puerto Penasco (Rocky Point) and is considered a safer route for visitors desiring access to beautiful beaches, resorts, cruises, multiple water sports and deep sea fishing.

Yumans are composed of three distinct groups - **The Year 'Rounder**, family or retired with permanent residence. The current permanent population is 98,900 as of July 2020, per U.S. Census estimates. Yuma is the county seat and the 11th largest city in Arizona. **Military Personnel** comprise about 30,000, with 5-6,000 permanent military staff at two bases, Marine Corps Air Station Yuma and the Yuma Proving Grounds, just north of Yuma. This includes rotational military (10,000), family members (7,500), civilians (1,500) and retirees (6,000).

Military wives and kids appreciate the sense of community here with a close relationship with others on base as well as being welcomed to Yuma.

Snowbirds & RVers make up the balance, with close to 85,000 settling in for enjoyable winter weather each season. RVers love the lifestyle within their RV communities, with a variety of recreational and social activities.

So it's obvious, Yuma is a very inviting setting for anyone seeking an open, warm desert setting.

Arizona Facts

The capital of Arizona is Phoenix. Arizona fills 113,628 square miles, making it the sixth largest state. Its borders touch California, Nevada, Utah, Colorado, New Mexico and Mexico.

State Flag: The top half has 13 stripes that pay tribute to the original U.S. colonies. They are arranged to depict the western setting sun. The copper star in the center was included when Arizona was the top-producing state of copper. The blue and yellow colors used are the Arizona State colors and the blue and red are the same shades found on the U.S. flag.

State bird: Cactus wren

State flower: Saguaro cactus bloom

State mammal: Ring-tail cat

State amphibian: Arizona tree frog

State fish: Apache trout

State neckwear: Bola tie

State tree: Palo Verde

State metal: Copper

State reptile: Ridge-nose rattlesnake

State gemstone: Turquoise

State butterfly: Two-tailed Swallowtail

State dinosaur: Sonorasaurus - bones were unearthed in Arizona in 1994.

State fossil: Petrified wood, found in Petrified Forest National Park in northern Arizona.

Official drink: Lemonade

State song: "Arizona March Song" by Margaret Row Clifford. An alternate, more popular song is "I Love Arizona" by Rex Allen, Jr.

State motto: "Ditat Deus," which means God Enriches

Arizona became a state on February 14, 1912, the last of the contiguous 48 states to enter the U.S.

The airport is currently served by American Airlines (800.433.7300, aa.com), providing up to four round trip flights daily between Yuma (YUM) and Phoenix Sky Harbor (PHX). The terminal has four car rental agencies, free WiFi and charging ports. A popular local Brewers Restaurant & Sports Bar (brewersrestaurant&sportsbar.com) operates a second location in the airport terminal. There is also a Military Comfort Center for military travelers.

A large parking area is within a few feet of the Passenger Terminal. Long term and short term parking lots are available 24 hours a day, year round. Rates are among the lowest in the country and the first 15 minutes are free.

Get outdoors with nature - Arizona Peace Trail

History

In 2013, the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), and the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD), conceived a plan to create a connector trail between Bullhead City in the north and Yuma in the south.

By joining forces, the BLM, AZGFD, La Paz County and local OHV clubs recognized the opportunity with a single-trail focused effort. By 2014, a team of 14 OHV clubs, under the leadership of J.C. Sanders, along with support from BLM, AZGFD, Yuma County, La Paz County and Mojave County, formed the **Arizona Peace Trail, Inc.** (AZPT) which gained non-profit status in July 2015.

Trail Formulation and Experience

The AZPT member clubs worked diligently, spending many hours of field research and coordination with numerous federal, state and local jurisdictions, and private property owners to ultimately define a 750-mile loop trail linking Mojave, La Paz and Yuma Counties. The trail has loops and segments of varying length and degrees of difficulty for multiple types of OHVs, including 4x4s, side-by-side utility vehicles, all-terrain vehicles and motorcycles. The trail is open to motorized and non-motorized users.

Trail users will experience dramatic landscape and ecosystem changes (elevation 170'-7070'),

many varieties of cacti, red rock landscapes, winding sand washes and river bottoms, narrow canyons and ridge-line trails, historic sites, and fantastic scenic beauty. Expect to see Big Horn Sheep, coyote, raptors, owls, deer, desert tortoise and other wildlife.

Over the Border **Los Algodones**

The friendly community of Los Algodones is located in Baja California, Mexico at the California-Arizona border. It is about 10 miles west of Yuma. Go west on I-8, take exit 166 and travel south on CA Hwy. 186/Andrade Rd., past the Quechan Casino & Resort.

It's best to park on the U.S. side in the secured Quechan Tribe parking lot for a nominal daily flat rate and walk less than one block to the port of entry. Most of the businesses in town are located less than four blocks from the border. American dollars are the currency of choice.

You'll find a wide variety of shopping and professional services, including gift shops, pharmacies, medical

and dental health professionals and open air cafés, offering prices that will make your trip worthwhile. Most businesses employ someone who is fluent in English, so you don't have to worry if you don't speak Spanish.

Los Algodones is recognized as a safe destination for tourists who stay in the main business section and are always aware of their surroundings. The small business community caters to snowbirds and American/Canadian travelers with cost savings in mind.

NOTE: American citizens must present their passport or passport card to re-enter the U.S. Children 18 and under need to present a birth certificate, naturalization certificate or passport to re-enter the U.S.

Yuma's only licensed marijuana dispensary knows you have questions about purchasing marijuana, either for medical or recreational use. Visit their website, jamestownnyuma.com or call **213.542.0665** if your questions aren't answered below.

Q: *Who is able to purchase?*

A: Adults over 21 may purchase up to 1 ounce of cannabis. Arizona Medical Marijuana card holders may purchase up to 2.5 ounces every two weeks.

Q: *How much can I purchase?*

A: Adults over 21 may possess up to 1 ounce, 28 grams per Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) (5 grams of concentrates).

Q: *How can we find you?*

A: We are located at **4340 E. 32nd St., Yuma** - 0.2 miles east of Avenue 4E, north side of 32nd St.

Q: *Is my medical card valid in Arizona?*

A: Only medical cards issued by the state of Arizona are valid under the medical marijuana program.

Q: *What can you buy without a medical card?*

A: Adults over 21 may purchase up to 1 ounce of flower, concentrates, cartridges, edibles or topicals. Edibles are limited to 100mg or 10mg per piece, up to 5 grams of cartridges or concentrates.

Q: *Can I just walk in?*

A: Currently we are accepting online orders only. Start at jamestownnyuma.com to create a profile and place your order.

Q: *How will I know when my order is ready?*

A: You will receive an Order Complete text message that will prompt you to call the dispensary to schedule a pickup time.

Q: *Do you accept credit/debit cards?*

A: We only accept cash. We have an ATM conveniently located in our lobby.

Q: *What are your Hours of Operation?*

A: We accept orders from 9am-5pm and pickups are from 10am-6pm. The dispensary is closed on Sundays.

Q: *Why are there no more promos, BOGOs or discounts?*

A: We understand your concern and want to assure you that these changes are temporary. As a result of the large increase in demand, in addition to testing fees, we must temporarily discontinue our specials to secure enough inventory to provide our patients with the medicine they need.
Note: We still provide our loyalty point system - get \$1 back for every \$50 spent.

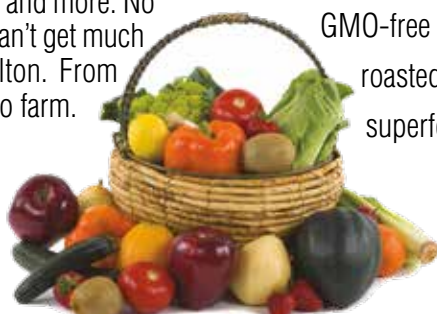

Yuma has been identified by *Business Insider* as being one of the top ten housing markets over the next five years, with a continual increase in home values here expected to exceed the projected national rate. Between 2010 and 2016 Yuma area home values increased an average of 5%. 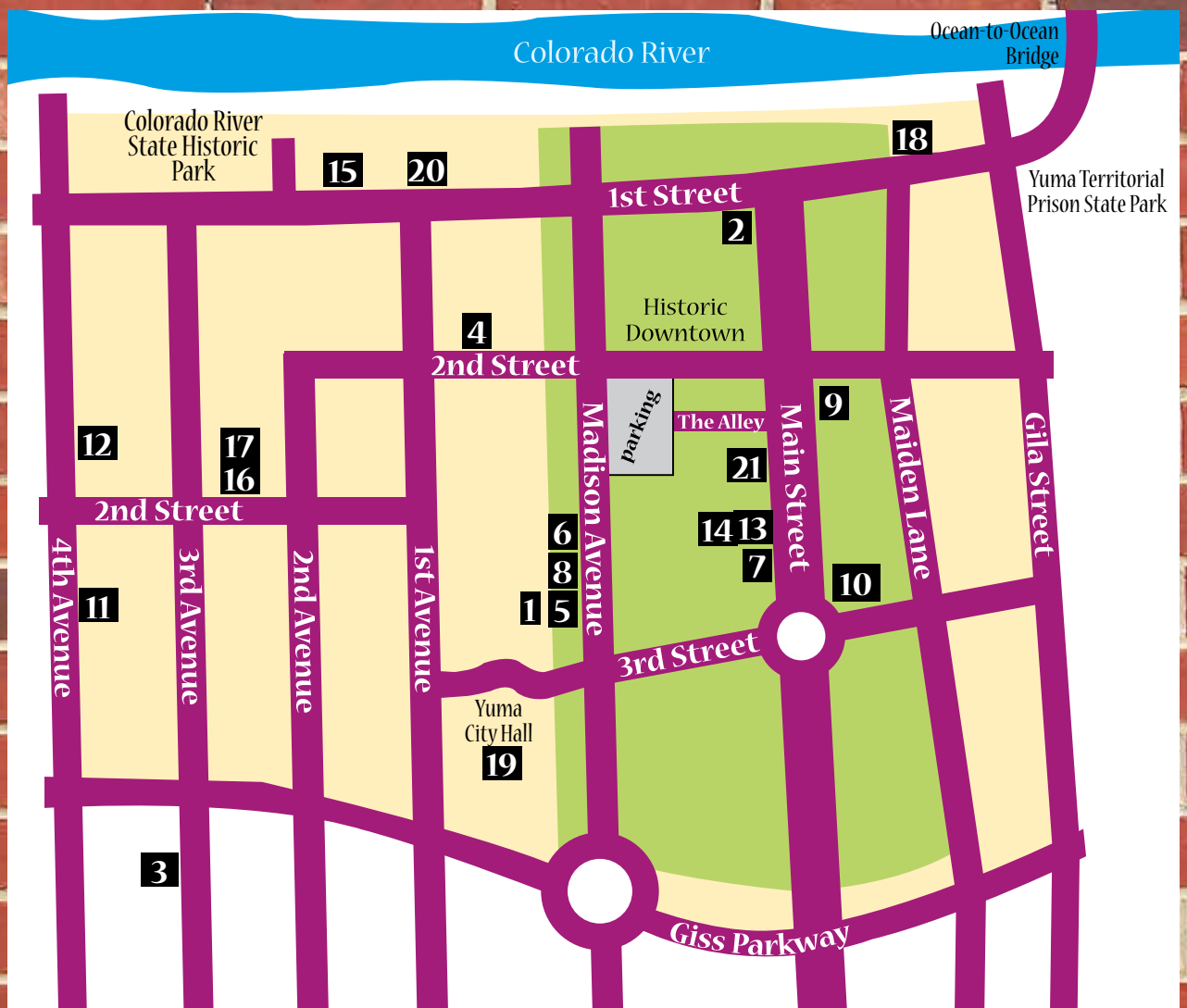

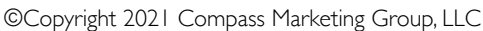

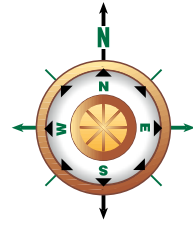
